# 1 Bluetooth Printing

## 1.1 Initial Setup

Set up the printer with Bluetooth Authentication:

- Use Zebra Setup Utilities:
- Set Bluetooth Authentication
- Set the PIN to 0000 or 1234

Enable Bluetooth on the device:

- Manually turn on Bluetooth on the device
- From the Android Bluetooth settings screen:
  - ◆ Detect devices
  - ◆ Pair with the printer device
  - ◆ Enter the PIN of the printer device.

## 1.2 Usage

Bluetooth must be enabled on the device to pick up the paired printers. If not, enable it - you do not have to exit the application, just switch to Android Settings/Bluetooth and enable it, then switch back.

If the printer is turned off, the application will warn that it cannot connect.

- Start the test application
- Click **List Devices**
  - A table of previously-paired devices will be listed. The list will show the type of device.  **Note:** When the application is integrated, this list will show only paired printers. Currently the list shows all paired devices. Only the devices labelled as **IMAGING** are the printers.
- Click on the row of the device you wish to print to.
- A popup will show, showing options of:
  - ◆ *Test Connection*
  - ◆ *Print Label*
  - ◆ *Close*
- Choose *Print Label* and a popup will show of 3 options:
  - ◆ *Receipt (6 by 2)* - this is the only label that will properly print on the MZ220. It will print on the QL420, although small.
  - ◆ *Despatch (6 by 4)* - this is a fairly simple despatch label with a barcode and item.
  - ◆ *Parcel (6 by 4)* - this is an example of a fairly complex DHL parcel label.
- Choose a label to print - a message should be shown of the status. In a couple of seconds, the label should appear on the printer.
